

5 Days Windsor Classic



Day 1:

10:00 am – 01:00 pm

Windsor

[Windsor Castle](#) (discover the castle with an audio-guide, allow 2, 5 to 3 hours)

01:00 pm – 02:00 pm

Have **lunch** in one of the many restaurants or pubs in Windsor (if you wish to re-enter the Castle later on you can get a wristband before leaving, at one of the Castle's shops).

02:00 pm – 04:00 pm

[Sightseeing Tour](#) with City Sightseeing Open Top Buses (45 mins on the bus plus hop on – hop off stops in Windsor, Eton, Datchet, Windsor Great Park).

Evening:

Dinner at one of the many restaurants – chose between traditional English food as well as Thai, Moroccan, South American, French food and many others. Visit to the [Theatre Royal](#) in Windsor (you can see many productions here which go to the West end in London afterwards).

Day 2:

Enjoy a full day in **London** with all its sights, street life, shopping, cultural events... Chose one of the award-winning "London Walks" and let the guide show you the capital with its many hidden treasures and stories! There are two train lines plus one bus service between Windsor and London and it will take you only one hour to get there.

Day 3:

10:00 am – 10:45 am

Windsor

Start the day with a short stroll around the Guildhall and Castle Hill – the oldest part of the town.

10:45 am – 11:15 am

Watch the [Guards](#) and their marching band on their way into or out of Windsor Castle (they march daily April to July and every second day rest of the year, but never on a Sunday).

12:00 noon – 01:00 pm

Only about 10 minutes drive away from Windsor, part of the [Windsor Great Park](#), there is the beautiful [Savill Garden](#), created in the 1930's for the Queen Mother, with over 35 acres of trees and shrubbery, ponds and streams and flowers all year round.

01:00 pm – 02:00 pm

The Restaurant in the Savill Building at the entrance to the garden is well known for **lunch** and coffee (after lunch back to Windsor).

03:15 pm – 04:30 pm

Guided tour of [Eton College](#) (ca. 15 mins walk from Windsor Castle).

05:15 pm – 06:00 pm

[Evensong at St. George's Chapel](#) in Windsor Castle.

Day 4:

Day-trip to **Oxford** – 44 miles/ 70 km away from Windsor (1 – 1,5 hours by train). Join a guided walking tour which includes the heart of this historic city and the university, Christ Church College and Cathedral. Visit the 1000 year old Oxford Castle, hire a punt from the boat house, take a relaxing walk in the botanical gardens. Climb the 14th century tower of St. Martin's church and enjoy the view across the city.

Day 5:

Bath – 93 miles/150 km away from Windsor (2 hours by train) see the finest Georgian city in Britain with over 5000 listed buildings, museums, galleries, Jane-Austen Centre, festivals and events. Take a bus or walking tour of the city centre, see the Roman Baths with the temple and bathing complex built around Britain's only naturally hot springs. Have lunch at the Pump Room and drink the hot spa water.
