

5 Days Windsor for Families



Day 1:

10:00 am - 01:00 pm

Windsor

[Windsor Castle](#) -discover the castle with an audio-guide, allow 2 ½ to 3 hours, a special children's audio tour in English is available.

01:00 pm – 02:00 pm

Have lunch in one of the many [restaurants or pubs](#) in Windsor (if you wish to re-enter the Castle later on you can get a wristband before leaving, at the exit)

03:00 pm – 04:00 pm

[Boat Trip](#) on the River Thames + feed the Swans on the River Thames

Or: Soar over 50 metres into the skies above historic Windsor - go on the giant [Royal Windsor Wheel](#) at Alexandra Gardens and enjoy spectacular panoramic views.

04:00 pm – 06:00 pm

[Windsor Leisure Centre](#) swimming pool with waves, slides and Jacuzzis.

Day 2:

10:00am – 05:00 pm

[Legoland](#)® an action-packed theme park for all the family. Shuttle bus available from Windsor town centre

Day 3:

London – go on a hop-on – hop-off bus tour and enjoy with your children the famous sights of the British capital. Pick one or two of more than 100 museums and art galleries (many of them are free of charge), see the London Dungeon, Madame Tussauds, the Tower of London and - so much more than you can fit into one day! There are two train lines plus one bus service between Windsor and London and it will take you only less than one hour to get there.

Day 4:

Take the family to Hampton Court – the palace of Henry VIII. You can take a boat from Runnymede Boathouse to Hampton Court Bridge (9:15 am – 1:15 pm), visit the Palace and come back to Windsor by train.

Day 5:

13 miles/ 21 km from Windsor: **Chiltern Open Air Museum** in Chalfont St. Giles (open 28/3 – 30/10/2009)

9 miles/ 15 km from Windsor: **The Look out Discovery centre** in Bracknell (for younger children) - an interactive science and nature exhibition Play area, bike hire.

9 miles/ 15 km from Windsor: **Go Ape** in Bracknell (tree top adventure centre for over 10 year olds, with rope ladders, Tarzan swings, giant rope net, etc., allow ca. 3 hours)

Only about 10 minutes drive away from Windsor, part of the Windsor Great Park, there is the beautiful **Savill Garden**, created in the 1930's for the Queen Mother, with over 35 acres of trees and shrubbery, ponds and streams and flowers all year round.

Children under 6 free have entry to garden (Play area, great walks, restaurant and shop)
