What type of ceremony is for you?

We are here to help you celebrate your love, but you can do that in lots of different ways.

A civil marriage or a civil partnership is available to all couples. It is also the only legal alternative to a religious marriage.

For a civil marriage or civil partnership to be legal, it must take place in any Register Office in England and Wales, or in a licensed venue, indoors or outdoors, and be conducted by a registrar from that district. As long as your ceremony includes the legally prescribed vows and no religious content, we welcome you personalising your ceremony as you wish, with personal vows, readings, poems, music or other individual elements.

With around 30 registrars in the Royal Borough, and history dating back to 1837, there is very little we can't help with when it comes to getting you married or civil partnered! If you have already married but wish to celebrate the occasion with friends and family or prefer to celebrate your commitment but without the legal side, we also offer a range of non-legally binding ceremonies to suit you – a wedding celebration ceremony, a renewal of vows, or a commitment ceremony. Likewise, if you wish to celebrate in a venue that isn't licensed, we can lead your celebration ceremony, perhaps even combining it with a visit to the Register Office to tie the legal knot before.

Getting Married

Whether your wedding is a huge celebration, a simple ceremony to put a seal on a long-term relationship, a legal marriage before you head abroad for a larger ceremony, or you are having a religious blessing later – we will make sure your ceremony suits you as a couple.

The first step is to decide where you want your marriage ceremony to take place. The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead has a Ceremony Room at the Register Office in the Town Hall in Maidenhead, plus many licensed venues to suit all styles and budgets. A list of all our licensed venues and links to their websites can be found at the back of this brochure, or on our <u>website</u>.

If you are marrying in the Maidenhead Ceremony Room at the Register Office, the venue and the registrars can be booked together directly with us. If you decide on a licensed venue, please contact them directly to check their availability, before contacting us to make a booking for the registrars to attend. If you are booking the Guildhall, please contact their team directly to make a provisional booking, they will then let us know and we will contact you to make the booking for the registrars to attend.

We take bookings up the end of the next financial year and require full payment at the time of booking. We have several teams of registrars working, especially on popular days and times of the year, so will always do our best to accommodate your chosen date and time. Do of course get in touch with us as soon as possible for best availability. For our fees and our booking request form, please see our website or visit the <u>government website</u> for more information.

Before getting married, you will both be required to give notice of your intent to marry at your local register office and more information about this can be found in this brochure on page 13 and 14.





Forming a Civil Partnership

For more information about whether a marriage or a civil partnership is for you, please see the information on the government <u>website</u>.

Civil partnerships are available to opposite sex and same sex couples and offer a legal alternative to marriage.

You can choose to form your partnership in any way you choose – from a simple signing of the documents with two witnesses, to a larger scale celebration. Your first step is to decide where you would like your ceremony to take place. The same locations are available to those marrying and those forming a civil partnership. The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead has a Ceremony Room at the Register Office in the Town Hall in Maidenhead, plus many licensed venues to suit all styles and budgets. A list of all our licensed venues and links to their websites can be found at the back of this brochure, or on our <u>website</u>.

If you choose to form your partnership in the Maidenhead Ceremony Room at the Register Office in the Town Hall, the venue and the registrars can be booked together directly with us. If you decide on a licensed venue, please contact them directly to check their availability, and then contact us to make a booking.





If you are considering holding your ceremony at the Windsor Guildhall, please contact the <u>Guildhall</u> team directly to make a provisional booking. They will let us know and we will then get in touch with you to confirm our availability and arrange the registrars attendance.

We take bookings up the end of the next financial year and require full payment at the time of booking. We have several teams of registrars working, especially on popular days and times of the year, so will always do our best to accommodate your chosen date and time. For our fees and our booking request form, please see our <u>website</u>.

Before forming your partnership, you will both be required to give notice of your intent to form a civil partnership at your local register office and more information about this can be found in this brochure on page 13 and 14 or go to the <u>government website</u> for more information.

While the perfect option for many couples, it is recommended that you ensure a civil partnership is right for you. In the UK the relationship between couples in a civil partnership is recognised legally in the same way as a married couple. However, if one of you is a foreign national or you plan to live abroad, the local laws of that country should be established to ensure your partnership will be recognised there. For opposite sex couples forming a civil partnership, there is not an option to change your partnership to a marriage at a future date.







Ceremonies at the Town Hall in Maidenhead

Alongside the range of licensed venues in the Royal Borough, we offer marriage and civil partnership ceremonies seven days a week in the Maidenhead Ceremony Room at the Register Office at the Town Hall in Maidenhead.

Your booking here includes the use of our ceremony room and the 2 registrars to lead and legalise your ceremony.

Are you looking for a very simple ceremony before your larger wedding celebration abroad? Do you want a traditional ceremony with up to 46 guests? Are you legalising a religious ceremony? Do you want to celebrate with us before you head to one of the famous fine dining establishments local to our Town Hall? No matter what your circumstances, we will look after you. Our ceremony room is fully air-conditioned with lots of natural light, and easily accessible to those with mobility issues. We offer two dedicated parking spaces directly at our front door, and have car parks opposite our offices and in the town centre for your guests. We have a good quality Bluetooth speaker to connect to a playlist on a phone or other device, a sound system for CDs or USB sticks, or we can play a suitable choice of our music, if you have no specific preferences.

After your ceremony, you can lead out to our patio and garden area at the front of the well-known Town Hall for photographs, and if you wish, your guests are welcome to shower you with (biodegradable) confetti!



Booking Your Registrars

We are so excited to make your booking with you! We are here to guide you through the whole process.



How to make a booking

Once you have chosen your venue and preferred date, please complete the booking form on our <u>website</u>.

If you are unable to use or access the internet, please leave us a voicemail on 01628 796422 to advise us.

Once we receive your booking request, a registrar will call you back to make the booking with you. We will discuss the next steps with you, confirm our availability, make the booking, and take full payment in advance. We will confirm the booking by email, sending a confirmation letter, and more information about what will happen next. Most importantly if you are marrying or forming a civil partnership we will advise you that the next step is to give legal notice – more information about this can be found on page 13 and 14.

Once your booking is in place, and the clock is ticking towards your big day, do get in touch with us at any time if we can help with anything.

Giving Notice

This is a legal preliminary required for most couples marrying or forming a civil partnership

(If you are marrying in the Church of England and neither of you are foreign nationals your legal preliminaries will take place in the form of banns in the Church). All other couples are required to give notice in the Register Office in the district in which you live, regardless of where your wedding is taking place.

If you live within the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead, you can give notice at our Register Office in Maidenhead, or at our satellite office at Windsor library on certain days.

Please email us at <u>ceremony.bookings@rbwm.gov.uk</u> if you wish to book an appointment.

You must have confirmed your venue and the type of ceremony before giving notice as these cannot be changed once your documents are issued. Doing so would require a new notice appointment and further statutory fees.

There is a fee payable each, and within the Royal Borough this is taken at the time of booking. Notices can be given up to 12 months ahead of your ceremony. The documents you are required to present, specific to your own personal circumstances, will be discussed with you at the time of booking, but a guide to what you are likely to require is given below. You must give notice in person and must have been resident in the UK for at least 7 full days prior to the appointment and have evidence to show this.

If you are a UK or Irish citizen or EU citizens with settled status, or have a valid marriage or fiancé/fiancée visa:

Notices must be given in your district of residence – if you live in separate districts, you will each give notice in your district of residence. Notices must be given at least 28 days in advance to allow for the legal waiting period to pass.

If you or your partner are foreign nationals and do not have a marriage or fiancé/fiancée visa:

Notices must be given together in the district of your residence. If you live separately, you can give notice in either of your districts of residence.

After you have given notice, the Home Office will consider your intent to marry/form a civil partnership and will decide if they need to investigate.

The legal waiting period will be either 28 or 70 days, as decided by the Home Office. Please allow plenty of time from the time of notice to your intended ceremony date for this reason.

Notice documents

We will discuss your individual circumstances when you book a notice appointment but documents we may request to see are outlined below. Please note we will require sight of your original documents, as photocopies, even if certified, are not acceptable. All documents must be currently valid and in date.

Evidence of your name, date of birth and nationality:

• Valid UK passport/valid Irish passport/valid EU passport with EUSS share code/other valid passport with your visa/evidence of your immigration status

If you do not hold a valid passport, you can provide:

- If born before 1983, your full UK birth certificate showing parents' details, along with valid photo ID
- If born after 1st January 1983, your full UK birth certificate plus your mother's birth certificate (or father's if your parents are or were ever married to each other at the time of your birth)
- If born after 1st July 2006, your full UK birth certificate showing parents' details, plus evidence of either of your parent's UK nationality or settled status at the time of your birth

Evidence of your address:

- Valid UK driving licence
- Most recent council tax bill
- Utility bill dated within the last 3 months
- Bank or building society statement dated in the last month
- If you are a temporary resident in our district, please discuss with us what you will be required to present
- Evidence of previous marital status (if applicable):
 - Your original decree absolute for a UK divorce (if applicable)
 - Death certificate of former spouse/partner

If you were divorced abroad, please ensure your documents are accurately translated (if not already in English) and be aware that these documents may need to be authorised by the Superintendent Registrar or the General Register Office. Please allow time for this and be aware an additional fee will apply

Evidence of any name change:

- Certificate from a previous marriage/civil partnership
- Change of name document
- Current documents as above if you use more than one name legally





On the day

All you need to know about the

running of your big day



In the run-up:

In advance of the ceremony, please complete your Ceremony Checklist sent at the time of booking. This helps us incorporate the vows you have chosen and helps you communicate other elements of the ceremony that are important to you too. We will pass this to the registrar who will be conducting your ceremony. If you are marrying at a licensed venue or at our Register Office over the weekend, then the registrar will call you to personally introduce themselves and have a chat about the day itself.

Please do remember that in the run up to the event, our team of registrars are available to answer any questions, to ensure your plans runs smoothly and soothe any nerves! You are in safe and expert hands with our experienced team, so we hope you can relax and enjoy this special part of your day.

Pre-ceremony interview:

We will guide you through the whole process on the day...in advance of the ceremony we will see both of you, either together or individually as you choose, privately away from your guests, to ask you to confirm the legal details and to offer you some last minute reassurance. We would ask you to be ready in good time, so that we do not have to compromise the content of your ceremony.

During the ceremony:

We will guide you through the whole ceremony. During a marriage ceremony, we will ask you to repeat your legal contracting and declaratory vows after us, so there is no need to remember anything or feel too nervous. You can also choose an extra vow for the exchange of rings and/or write your own personal vows or promises. For a civil partnership, there are no legally prescribed vows but you can read aloud the legal statement, or include your own vows which can be read out or repeated after the registrar. You may also include personal vows if you choose. We welcome your own choices of music, poems, readings or other personal elements if you wish to include them. Likewise if you wish to keep things very simple, let us know and we will always work with your requests.

Readings/Poems/Songs:

Readings are a wonderful way of personalising your ceremony and up to 3 can be incorporated into your ceremony if you choose. It can be very special to choose someone meaningful to you to present these.

We have a range of our team's favourite readings to share

with you <u>here</u>, but there are a huge range of readings and poems available on the internet.

If not one of our suggestions, then please share your readings with us in advance, so we can confirm they are suitable (as long as they are not religious, then you can really go to town choosing anything that suits you and your ceremony), and to ensure we have a copy with us on the day, just in case.

Music:

Music really adds to the atmosphere and can reflect your personalities perfectly. From a string quartet or a harp to your favourite rock tune, as long as it is not overtly religious in nature, anything goes as far as we are concerned!

Exchanging Rings:

Many couples choose to exchange rings to seal the deal! It can be nice to include a loved family member, best man, friend, bridesmaid/page boy or friend to present these during the ceremony, but you can also have them with you, or on the table at the front during the ceremony.

Personal vows:

If you wish to write your own vows and read/say them to each other, you are welcome to do so, and this can be a very special moment in your ceremony. We can present them to you to read at the right moment. If you don't wish to share them with each other before, then feel free to send them to us separately in advance.



Photography and Social Media:

You are welcome to bring professional photographers and videographers to our ceremony room and our licensed venues. We know how important it is to capture the essence of your celebration. We will always do our best to work with them to ensure they get the best shots. Likewise, if you choose friends and family to take photographs, they are welcome to do so.

If you wish us to let your guests know you prefer them not to take pictures or post on social media, just let us know and we will nicely let them know at the start of the ceremony.

Witnesses:

The minimum number of guests you can have with you is your 2 witnesses. For all ceremonies, please select 2 guests, who must be over 16, able to understand English and have understood what has taken place. They do not require ID.

Certificates:

On the day we will complete a commemorative certificate which you, your witnesses and the registrars sign alongside your legal documents. We will present this to you at the end of your ceremony.

We then register your marriage or civil partnership in our office, and your legal certificates will be posted to you within a few days of the ceremony. If you require additional certificates to those purchased at the time of booking, please email us in advance of the ceremony. Extra copies are always available after the event too.



Celebration Ceremonies

A celebration ceremony does not hold legal status, but is a popular and symbolic way of celebrating your relationship or a recent marriage.

You might choose this type of ceremony for a variety of reasons. Perhaps you wish to celebrate your relationship publicly without a legal obligation. You may have had a small legal ceremony elsewhere or abroad and now wish to celebrate that with a larger gathering of friends and family. Perhaps the place you wish to celebrate isn't licensed. Whatever the reason, we are here to help you plan the occasion that works for you. You can choose wherever in our Borough you want this to take place, including at your home – as long as the venue is suitable, our celebrants can attend and conduct the ceremony of your choice. No legal preliminaries are required, so you can time this event as soon as you choose. These can of course also be combined with a legal ceremony too if you so choose, on the same day or at a different time.

You can also personalise the ceremony as you wish and include traditional elements such as being escorted up the aisle, exchanging rings, sharing vows and including music and readings. If you choose you can sign your commemorative certificate along with witnesses and have this presented to you. We will chat through with you how you would like your special ceremony to be.

Renewal of Vows

Your ceremony could be a celebration of a special milestone or anniversary in your relationship, or a celebration of overcoming a difficult time in your lives. Perhaps you didn't like the way you did it the first time and want to have the celebration of your dreams together! Whatever the reason, we can guide you through a wonderful celebration.

No legal preliminaries are required, so you can time this event as soon as you choose, and it can take place anywhere that works for you. This type of ceremony can also be personalised as you wish and include personal elements such as being escorted up the aisle, exchanging rings, sharing vows and including vows and readings. If you choose you can sign your commemorative certificate along with witnesses and have this presented to you. We will work with you to make sure your continued commitment to each other is celebrated in the special way it deserves.

Outdoor Ceremonies

The edge of a river, a wildflower meadow, a walled garden, an island estate in the middle of the river, the private grounds of a rustic barn – these are just some of the amazing outdoor locations you can legally marry or form a civil partnership in the Royal Borough.

Since 2022, it is now possible to marry outdoors anywhere in the grounds of a licensed venue. If the outdoor space you have dreamt of for your ceremony is not attached to a licensed venue, please see page 20 for information about our bespoke celebration ceremonies, which we could combine with a legal ceremony at another time.





Information about Religious Marriages

If you are marrying in the Church of England, the usual process is to arrange this with the vicar and your legal preliminaries will take place in the form of your banns being read. You will only need to present yourselves at your local Register Office to give notice of your intent to marry if either of you is a foreign national and subject to immigration control. If you are marrying in any other Church or religious premises authorised for marriage, you will need to give notice of your intent to marry, in the same way as outlined on page 13 and 14.

If you have been married in a religious ceremony that does not hold legal status in the UK, please contact us to arrange a legal marriage ceremony. This can be a simple as you choose.

All Church and other legal religious marriages in our district are registered at our Register Office after the event has taken place. After this has happened, please email us at ceremony.bookings@rbwm.gov.uk for the link to order your marriage certificates, which we will post out to you.



Information about Marrying Abroad

Unfortunately, we are not able to provide advice about the legal requirements of marriage in individual countries, as you would be marrying under local marriage law. More information can be found on the <u>government website</u>.

If the country in which you intend to marry requires a Certificate of No Impediment and you are a resident of the Royal Borough, then please contact us for an appointment. This is available to UK citizens only.

If you have already married abroad, there is no facility or requirement to register your marriage in the UK. If you married following the local law of the country, and you would have been allowed to marry by law in the UK, then your marriage should be legally recognised in the UK. If you have any doubts, then please seek legal advice. We would recommend you obtain an extra marriage certificate at the time of your marriage, as we will not be able to help you access a further copy.

Some couples decide they wish to celebrate their marriage in a ceremony aboard, but without the sometimes complex processes involved in having the legal ceremony there. In that case we would be delighted to arrange your legal marriage ceremony here with us, at the Register Office Ceremony Room, or at one of our licensed venues, and you are then free to celebrate as you wish abroad. In this scenario, your marriage would be registered in the UK. We can keep things very simple if you wish not to detract from your larger celebration following abroad.



Naming Ceremonies

Celebrate your new addition with a naming ceremony, which is offered as a wonderful personal alternative to a baptism or christening. We welcome families with children of all ages, and could celebrate a new baby or older child, or a welcome much loved adopted child, or stepchild, or multiple children in the family.

Naming ceremonies require no legalities, so can take place anywhere in the Royal Borough, at our Register Office, one of our beautiful venues or anywhere you choose that is suitable, including at your home. If you choose to hold your event at a venue, please make sure they are available and then contact us to book your celebrant.

You can include promises, guide parents, grandparents, music, readings and presentation of gifts, a certificate signing or any elements you choose. We will work with you to ensure we deliver the perfect ceremony that is personalised for your family.





Frequently Asked Questions

Can I get married in the Royal Borough if I don't live here?

Lots of couples from across the UK and abroad choose to marry in this historic county. You can have a civil marriage wherever you choose in England or Wales, but you must both give notice in person of your intent to marry in the Register Office in the district where you live. If you live abroad but have been resident in the UK for at least 7 full days, then you can give notice.

Should I get married in a Church/religious building or have a civil ceremony?

Civil marriage is offered as a legal alternative to a religious marriage. For that reason, we cannot include any religious elements or readings. We are happy to hand over to someone else before we depart e.g. a minister of religion at the end of the ceremony who can guide you through a blessing. We regularly attend venues where the couple are holding a large religious ceremony and can conduct your civil ceremony as part of the day.

Is a celebrant-led marriage legal?

No, according to the marriage law of this country, a celebrant can only offer a celebratory ceremony which is not legally binding. You would additionally need to go through legal preliminaries and a legal marriage ceremony in a Register Office or licensed venue at a separate time in order to be legally married.

If you choose us to marry you, you know you will be legally married there and then on the day!

How far ahead can I book the registrars?

You can book our services for any date in the current and next financial year. Our fees and diaries for the following financial year are released at the end of March each year, and all the information around current fees and booking date range are kept updated on our website.

Where will we sign the legal documents and who can be witnesses?

The signing takes place in the ceremony room or outdoor location you have chosen in front of your friends and family. Witnesses can be friends, relatives or anyone who is over 16, understands English and what marriage/civil partnership represents. They do not need to bring ID. They will sign the marriage or civil partnership schedule and the commemorative certificate, and photographs can be taken during the signing if you wish.

I had a simple marriage abroad for legal reasons but now wish to celebrate with friends and family here in the UK

We can offer a celebration ceremony. This is not legally binding and cannot contain the legal marriage vows, but we have a range of alternative suggested vows, or you can write your own. Otherwise, you can celebrate as you choose, with bridesmaids, exchanging rings, being walked down the aisle – plenty of ways to make it really special!

We need to change the date of our ceremony - is that possible?

We understand that circumstances can change. When you book, we will discuss the terms and conditions with you and send them to you in your confirmation email. You can bring your ceremony forward (assuming you have given notice already) or postpone for up to year from the original ceremony date. There will be an administrative charge for the rebooking, plus any small increase or refund in the fees paid depending on whether you move to a date attracting a higher or lower price.

When you give notice, your documents are valid for a year, so if your new date is beyond the date you gave notice then you may need to give notice again.

Can we have drinks before or during the ceremony?

Food and drink cannot be consumed in the ceremony room/ area for an hour before or during the ceremony. Of course, a drinks reception away from the ceremony room is fine and in the ceremony a glass of water to soothe a nervous dry mouth is totally fine!

What is the difference between a civil partnership and a same sex marriage?

In the UK civil partnership was originally introduced as an alternative to same sex marriage. Now marriage is available to all couples, and more recently civil partnership has also been made available to opposite sex couples. So, the choice of marriage and civil partnership is available to all couples. There can be confusion between a civil marriage and a civil partnership – civil marriage is a non-religious legal marriage conducted by a registrar. A civil partnership is a legal alternative to this. Please see the information on the government website.

Please note if you are same sex couple in a civil partnership this can be changed to be a marriage if you so choose. This is because for some couples they did not have the option of marriage at the time they formed their partnership. This is therefore not an option for opposite sex couples, who must dissolve their partnership if they wish to be married.

Can I change the name in my passport to my new married name before my wedding/honeymoon?

You can apply for a passport in your partner's surname from 3 months ahead of the ceremony, as long as you have already given notice. The new passport will be dated from the date of the ceremony and will be rescinded if the marriage of civil partnership does not take place. The form can be found on the government website.

If you are marrying here with us at the Royal Borough, we are happy to complete this for you, but would ask that you send the completed form with your sections completed, and a stamped addressed envelope for us to return it to you. We will do this as soon as we receive it.

Why are my parents' details included on the marriage documents and certificates?

Parents appear in the online register and the certificates for ancestry reasons.

The law changed in 2021 to modernise the registration process. Previously only fathers could appear in the register. That has been changed to include mothers, step-parents (if they are or have been married to the birth/adoptive parent), and same-sex parents. Deceased parents can of course also be included. If you choose not to have a parent included for your own reasons, we will totally respect that.

I want to change my name after marriage – how does that work?

Your marriage or civil partnership will be contracted using your current legal names and these are then shown on your marriage/civil partnership certificate.

There is no requirement for either party to change their names afterwards or make an immediate decision – this is a personal decision for you both.

Your certificate is the evidence of your entitlement to use either name, or to double-barrel your names. There is no specific moment when the name changes, so you can do this in your own time e.g. when your passport expires. If you are changing to an option that is not one of your surnames, you would need to do this by deed poll.



What if I am nervous or emotional on the day and forget my words?


Please don't worry about a thing – nerves and excitement can play a part in your big day, but we are here to guide you through it. No need to remember a thing – just simply repeat your vows after the registrar, who will say them in bite-sized chunks...so you can relax and enjoy your special moment. We will also make sure we have tissues and encourage you to take your time if you need to compose yourself, or we can say it again, it's not a problem at all.

Do I need to bring anything on the day?

No, just yourselves! Neither you or your witnesses require any ID. You have shown that when you gave notice, and we will have all the paperwork with us.

How long does the ceremony usually last?

From the moment you enter to the time the signing is completed is usually around 30 minutes, depending on the elements you include. And then - signed, sealed, delivered!


