ROYAL BERKSHIRE HOTEL



HOW TO GET HERE

Travelling to Windsor by plane: Windsor is just 12 miles from London Heathrow Airport and easily accessible from London's other airports.

Travelling to Windsor by train: It is easy to travel to the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead by train with key stations in Windsor & Eton, Maidenhead and Ascot.

Travelling to Windsor by car: Windsor and the Royal Borough is easily accessible via the motorway network but road approaches can get busy during major events and in the high season.

Travelling to Windsor by bus and coach: Buses run from local towns and transport hubs including London and Reading. There is an express coach service from London and escorted coach tours.

Travelling to Windsor on foot and by bike: Once you're in the area, there is an extensive network of cycling routes in Windsor and Maidenhead (via the National Cycle Network) and footpaths including the Thames Path.
